Message from the President

The COVID virus drastically limited your Board of Directors' ability to meet and conduct community business during 2020. As we followed the Governor's proclamations the office was closed for several weeks and after restrictions lifted, opened with limited hours. Your water department staff works diligently to maintain safe water for your use and performed priority and routine maintenance tasks alike. A number of community improvement projects slated for the 2020 work party will hopefully be completed during our next planned work day May 15, 2021 (breakfast at 8am, work at 9am). Some of the projects include mulching limbs, replacing the rotted logs along Osborne Rd with post and cable fencing, cleaning/organizing the office and a few other items needing attention. Let the office know if you can help and please note that the work party will depend on any restrictions from the Governor's office.

On another note, I met with Lewis County Road engineers early last year to look at damages from the 2019 heavy rainfall which resulted in extensive flooding and some washed out driveways. After three hours of discussion several recommendations were made that PCC can pursue in order to minimize future flooding damage. The work mainly centers around the diversion dam and is dependent on Washington Fish & Wildlife review and approval of the suggested project (currently in process). Lewis County also plans to replace two culverts at the corner of Nisqually Way and Osborne Rd with one larger fish friendly culvert during summer 2021. A second fish friendly culvert is planned to replace the current culvert on Paradise Drive, depending on future funding availability.

Lastly, our water department is seeking a part-time person to work with our water staff. Duties include recording water usage, monitoring chlorine levels, collect and analyze water samples, and monitor well house distribution equipment to name a few. Training is provided as well as required certification training to meet state guidelines. If interested contact Ben Pacatte, Water Department Manager for more information or leave a message at the office.
